A BY-LAW TO PROHIBIT LITTERING ON PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PROPERTY

WHEREAS the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M. 45, as amended, provides that municipalities may pass by-laws prohibiting the throwing, placing or depositing of refuse or debris on private property or on property of the municipality or any local board thereof without authority from the owner or occupant of such property;

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Orangeville as follows:

- No person shall throw, place or deposit any refuse or debris on private property or on property of the municipality or any local board thereof without authority from the owner or occupant of such property.
- Any person who contravenes paragraph 1 of this by-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine or penalty as provided for under the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O., 1990 Chapter P.33 as amended.
- 3. That section 1 is hereby designated as a part of this By-law to which the Administrative Penalty By-law being By law 2025-049 as amended from time to time, or any successor thereof applies.

- 4. Any person who contravenes any designated Provision shall, upon issuance of a penalty notice in accordance with the Administrative Penalty By-law, be liable to pay an administrative penalty and any applicable administrative fees.

- 5. By-law Number 30-78 is hereby repealed.
- 6. This by-law shall be known as the "Littering Bylaw".
