



## **The Corporation of the Town of Orangeville**

### **By-law Number 2022-024**

#### **A by-law to amend By-law 2022-003 being a By-law to regulate election signs**

WHEREAS Council wishes to amend By-law 2022-003.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Council of the Corporation of the Town of Orangeville hereby enact as follows:

1. That Section 3.3 be deleted and replaced with:

“3.3 No person shall place an election sign within a Campaign Office unless a Candidate has filed his or her nomination and in accordance with the Town’s Sign By-law.”

2. That the following be added as Section 6.5:

“6.5 Every person who contravenes any provision of this By-law, including failing to comply with an order made under this By-law, is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine, and such other penalties, as provided for in the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P. 33, as amended, and the Municipal Act, 2001, as amended.”

3. That section 6.5 be renumbered as section 6.6 and replaced with the following:

“6.6 Any person who is charged with an offence under this By-law or an Order issued pursuant to this By-law or every director or officer of a corporation, who knowingly concurs in the contravention by the laying of an information under Part III of the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P. 33, as amended and is found guilty of the offence is liable pursuant to the Municipal Act, 2001, as amended to the following:

- (a) on a first offence, to a fine not more than \$50,000.00; and
- (b) on a second offence and each subsequent offence, to a fine of not more than \$100,000.00

4. That sections 6.6 to 6.10 be renumbered at 6.7 to 6.11.
