By-law Number 2026-021

A By-law to licence and regulate Salvage Yards in the Town of Orangeville

Whereas section 9 of the *Municipal Act, 2001* provides that a municipality has the capacity, rights, powers and privileges of a natural person for the purpose of exercising its authority under the *Municipal Act, 2001* or any other Act; and

Whereas subsection 11(1) of the *Municipal Act, 2001* provides that a municipality may provide any service or thing that the municipality considers necessary or desirable for the public; and

Whereas Section 11(2) of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25*, as amended hereinafter referred to as the "*Municipal Act*", provides authority for a municipality to pass bylaws that sustain and promote the economic, social and environmental well-being of the Town, including respecting climate change; and

Whereas pursuant to the provisions of Part IV of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, as amended, a municipality may pass bylaws for licensing, regulating and governing businesses; and

Whereas subsection 151(1) of the *Municipal Act, 2001* provides that, without limiting section 9 and 11 of the Act, a municipality may provide for a system of licences with respect to a business and may:

- (a) Prohibit the carrying on or engaging in the business without a licence; and
- (b) Refuse to grant a licence or to revoke or suspend a licence; and
- (c) Impose conditions as a requirement of obtaining, continuing to hold or renewing a licence; and
- (d) Impose special conditions on a business in a class that have not been imposed on all of the businesses in that class in order to obtain, continue to hold or renew a licence; and
- (e) Impose conditions, including special conditions, as a requirement of continuing to hold a licence at any time during the term of the licence; and
- (f) Licence, regulate or govern real and personal property used for the business and the persons carrying it on or engaged in it; and

- (g) Require a person, subject to such conditions as the municipality considers appropriate, to pay an administrative penalty if the municipality is satisfied that the person has failed to comply with any part of a system of licenses established by the municipality.; and

Whereas Section 431 of the *Municipal Act* authorizes that where any bylaw of a municipality under the Municipal Act is contravened and a conviction entered, in addition to any other remedy and to any penalty imposed by the bylaw, the court in which the conviction has been entered and any court of competent jurisdiction thereafter may make an order prohibiting the continuation or repetition of the offence by the person convicted and requiring the person convicted to correct the contravention; and

Whereas Section 436 of the *Municipal Act* authorizes a municipality to pass a bylaw providing that the municipality may enter on land to conduct inspections; and

Whereas Sections 444 and 445 of the *Municipal Act* authorize a municipality to make orders to discontinue, or to correct, the contravention of a bylaw;

Now therefore, be it resolved that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Orangeville hereby enacts as follows:

1. Definitions

- 1.1 "**Acquire**" means to purchase, receive directly or indirectly, take in exchange, accept, trade or otherwise deal with, and acquisition has a corresponding meaning;
- 1.2 "**Applicant**" means any **person** who has applied for a licence under this bylaw;
- 1.3 "**Clerk**" means the **Clerk** for the **Town** or any **person** designated by the **Clerk**;
- 1.4 "**Council**" means the Municipal **Council** for the Corporation of the **Town** of Orangeville;
- 1.5 "**Corporation**" includes a company, **corporation**, cooperative, partnership, firm, sole proprietorship, association, society, organization, or any other legal entity that is not an Individual;
- 1.6 "**Dispose**" means to sell, offer for sale, part with directly or indirectly, trade, exchange, or otherwise deal with, and disposition and **disposed** have a corresponding meaning;
- 1.7 "**Holding Area**" means a part of the premises for a **salvage yard** in which goods, articles or objects are retained and not offered or displayed for the purposes of disposition;
- 1.8 "**Licensee**" means a **person** licensed under this Bylaw;

- 1.9 **"Licence Issuer"** means the Clerk or such person designated by the Clerk to issue a licence.
- 1.10 **"Officer"** means a municipal law enforcement **officer** appointed by the Municipal **Council**, a police **officer** with the OPP, an employee or agent of the **Town** whose responsibilities include the enforcement of this Bylaw;
- 1.11 **"Owner"** means a **person** who, alone or with others, fits into any one or more of the following categories:
- a) the registered **owner** of the land;
 - b) the **person** for the time being managing or receiving the rent for the land in connection with which the word is used, whether on the **person's** own account or as agent or trustee of any other **person**, or who would receive the rent if the land were let;
 - c) a lessee or occupant of the land under the terms of a lease.
- 1.12 **"Person"** includes an individual, sole proprietorship, partnership, limited partnership, trust, **corporation** and an individual in his or her capacity as a trustee, executor, administrator or other legal representative;
- 1.13 **"Register"** means a permanent record (paper or electronic), kept at the licensed premises, in which the licence holder records each transaction where goods, articles, or objects are received or **acquired** for the **salvage yard**.
- 1.14 **"Salvage Yard"** includes but is not limited to a business where scrap metal, material from demolished buildings or structures, recyclable material, scrapped, demolished or inoperable motor vehicles or appliances or their parts, junk or salvage of any type is received, processed, stored or dismantled prior to being sold or **disposed**, and includes an automobile wrecking yard, junkyard or scrap yard.
- 1.15 **"Town"** means the **Corporation** of the **Town** of Orangeville and land within the geographic limits of the **Town** of Orangeville as the context requires;

2. General administration

- 2.1 The short title of this bylaw is the "Salvage Yard Bylaw".
- 2.2 This bylaw applies throughout the whole of the **Town**.
- 2.3 The Clerks Division is responsible for the administration of the Bylaw. Enforcement shall be carried out by **officers** as defined by the Bylaw

3. General prohibitions

- 3.1 No **person** shall operate a **salvage yard** without a valid licence issued under this Bylaw.
- 3.2 The licence holder must display the valid **salvage yard** Licence in a clearly visible place on the premises at all times while the business is operating.
- 3.3 No holder of a **salvage yard** licence, or their employee(s), shall **acquire** goods, articles, or objects;
 - 3.3.1 On which a serial number has been obliterated, altered, mutilated, or removed without the prior consent of the OPP;
 - 3.3.2 From any **person** without first verifying their identity using two pieces of authentic, valid, current, government-issued identification, one of which shall include a photograph, in the presence of the **person** being verified;
 - 3.3.3 From any **person** who is, or appears to be, under the age of eighteen (18) years of age; or
 - 3.3.4 From any **person** who appears to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- 3.4 No holder of a **salvage yard** licence shall alter, repair, or **dispose** of any goods, articles or objects **acquired** by them without:
 - 3.4.1 First, keeping such goods, articles or objects within a **holding area** for a period of no less than five (5) business days from the date such goods, articles or objects were **acquired**; and
 - 3.4.2 During the period prescribed in subsection 3.4.1 of this section, ensuring that the goods, articles or objects have not been displayed or made visible for the purpose of disposition.
- 3.5 No holder of a **salvage yard** licence shall at any time leave, place, store, exhibit or expose any goods, articles or objects in any place other than the premises so licensed.
- 3.6 No **person** shall hinder or obstruct, or attempt to hinder or obstruct, any **person** who is exercising a power or performing a duty under this Bylaw, including but not limited to carrying out an inspection.
- 3.7 No holder of a **salvage yard** licence shall operate, permit, or allow the license to be used, in whole or in part, as an impound yard for the storage of vehicles seized, detained, or towed pursuant to any statute, regulation, or municipal bylaw.

4. Regulations

- 4.1 Every holder of a **salvage yard** shall:
 - 4.1.1 Keep and maintain a **register**, in a form prescribed by the **Clerk**, of all goods, articles or objects **acquired** by them;
 - 4.1.2 Open the **register** required under paragraph 4.1.1 of this section to inspection at all times during regular business hours by an **officer**;
- 4.2 Every holder of a **salvage yard** who has reasonable and probable grounds to believe that a **person** offering any goods, articles or objects is unable to satisfactorily account for them, or is wilfully giving false information as to the same, or that such goods, articles or objects are stolen or have been illegally obtained, shall refuse to **acquire** such goods, articles or objects.
- 4.3 Every **salvage yard** shall erect and maintain a solid fence, having a minimum height of 2.5 metres (7 feet) on all boundaries of the **salvage yard** to obscure the view of the salvage materials unless otherwise permitted or restricted by the **Town's** Zoning Bylaw.
- 4.4 Every **licensee** shall, at their own expense, obtain and submit to the **licence issuer** an Environmental Site Assessment prepared by a Qualified **Person** within six (6) months of initial application and at least once every five (5) years from the date of the most recent environmental site assessment.
- 4.5 For the purposes of this section, a "Qualified **Person**" means a **person** who is licensed or certified in accordance with applicable provincial legislation and is qualified to conduct environmental site assessments
- 4.6 The environmental site assessment shall:
 - 4.6.1 Assess the condition of the soil, surface water and groundwater on the licensed premises;
 - 4.6.2 Identify any actual or potential contamination resulting from the operation of the **salvage yard**;
 - 4.6.3 Confirm compliance with applicable provincial environmental standards; and
 - 4.6.4 Include recommendations for remediation where required.
- 4.7 Where an environmental site assessment identifies contamination exceeding applicable standards, the **licensee** shall:

- 4.7.1 Immediately notify the appropriate provincial authority where required by law; and
- 4.7.2 Submit a remediation plan to the **Town** within sixty (60) days.
- 4.7.3 As a condition of holding a licence, the licensed premises may be subject to inspection by the Town's Fire Services at reasonable times to assess fire safety conditions and potential fire hazards.

5. Application for a Licence

- 5.1 A **person** making an application for a licence or renewal of a licence shall submit to the satisfaction of the Licence Issuer:
 - 5.1.1 A complete application in the form provided by the **Town**;
 - 5.1.2 Where the **applicant** is a **corporation**, a copy of the articles of incorporation or other incorporating documents issued by the Province of Ontario or the Government of Canada, and the business name registration, when applicable;
 - 5.1.3 Where the **applicant** is the sole proprietor, a copy of the business name registration, when applicable;
 - 5.1.4 Where the **applicant** is a registered partnership, a copy of the registered declaration of partnership, the names and addresses of each member of the partnership, as well as the name under which the partnership intends to carry on business and a copy of the business name registration;
 - 5.1.5 Two (2) pieces of valid government-issued identification, at least one of which shall include a photograph, from the following:
 - a) Canadian Passport;
 - b) Driver's licence;
 - c) Canadian birth certificate;
 - d) Citizenship card;
 - e) Permanent resident card;
 - f) Valid work permit;
 - 5.1.6 Valid commercial general liability insurance in an amount not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence, naming the **Town** as an additional insured, and shall maintain such insurance throughout the term of the **licence**.
 - 5.1.7 The applicable licence fee;

5.1.8 Any other documents as may be required by the **Licence issuer**.

5.2 Notwithstanding section 5.1, a **licensee** is not required to submit on renewal of a licence the items listed in sections 5.1.2, 5.1.3, and 5.1.4, provided no changes have occurred in the information contained in those documents.

5.3 A **person** making an application for the renewal of a licence shall submit a complete application and all required documents fourteen (14) days prior to the expiry of the current licence.

5.4 Applications not containing all of the information and documentation requested of the **applicant** shall be automatically rejected.

6. Fees

6.1 A fee for a licence, inspection, approval required, or replacement of a licence shall be prescribed in the Fees and Charges Bylaw.

7. Authority

7.1 The **licence issuer** is hereby delegated the authority to administer this Bylaw and to issue a licence in accordance with the provisions of the Bylaw and the applicable Schedules to this Bylaw.

7.2 The licence issuer is hereby delegated the authority to impose additional terms and conditions on a licence that, in the opinion of the **licence issuer**, are reasonable and take into consideration:

7.2.1 The health, safety and well-being of **persons**;

7.2.2 The past conduct of an **applicant** or **licensee**.

7.3 The **licence issuer** is hereby delegated the authority to revoke, suspend, refuse to issue, or refuse to renew a licence, where the **applicant** or **licensee** would not be entitled to a licence, or to the renewal of a licence, on any grounds set out in this Bylaw.

7.4 The **licence issuer** may cancel a licence at any time upon written request of the **licensee**.

7.4.1 No refund or partial refund of any licence fee shall be provided where a licence is cancelled, suspended, revoked or expires.

7.5 The **licence issuer** shall not issue or renew a licence to a **person** that does not meet the threshold criteria established by the **Town** policies or written procedures.

- 7.6 The **licence issuer** shall not issue or renew a licence to a **person** that has:
- 7.6.1 Two or more related convictions within the last year concerning the licensed business or **person**;
 - 7.6.2 Overdue bylaw fines, penalties or other monies owing to the **Town**;
 - 7.6.3 Outstanding property taxes and late payment charges owing to the **Town** for the premises subject to the licence application, where applicable.
- 7.7 The appeal tribunal shall have the same powers as the **licence issuer** pursuant to this Bylaw for the purpose of authorizing the issuing of a licence.

8. Licence

- 8.1 A licence shall be issued by the **licence issuer** upon being satisfied that the requirements of the Bylaw have been met
- 8.2 A licence is valid for one (1) year from the date it is issued and shall expire on the first anniversary of the date of issuance, unless it is sooner suspended, revoked, or cancelled in accordance with this Bylaw.
- 8.3 Every licence shall remain at all times the property of the **Town** and no **person** shall enjoy the vested right of a licence or the continuance of a licence.
- 8.4 The issuing of a licence does not relieve a **person** from any responsibility to obtain all other approvals that may be required from any level of government or authority or agencies thereof having jurisdiction.
- 8.5 A licence is not transferable.

9. Licence – Terms and Conditions – General

- 9.1 A **licensee** shall notify the licence issuer within seven (7) days:
- 9.1.1 Of any change of name, address or any other change to the information related to the licence;
 - 9.1.2 Where the **licensee** is a **corporation**, of any change in the names and addresses of officers and directors, the location of the corporate head office and a change of ownership of shares;
 - 9.1.3 Where the **licensee** is a registered partner, of any change in the names and addresses of each member of the partnership;

- 9.2 Subject to any changes in section 9.1, the licence shall be returned immediately to the licence issuer for amendment.
- 9.3 A **licensee** shall operate in compliance with this Bylaw, the terms and conditions of a licence, including the terms and conditions outlined in the applicable Schedule(s) to this Bylaw and all federal and provincial legislation.
- 9.4 A **licensee** in carrying out a business under this Bylaw shall provide services that are free from discrimination and respect all grounds protected by the Ontario Human Rights Code.
- 9.5 A **licensee** in carrying out a business licensed under this Bylaw shall not, with respect to any **person** being guided or assisted by a service animal:
- 9.5.1 Refuse to provide service to a **person**;
 - 9.5.2 Refuse to permit a **person** to enter with the service animal into or upon any place or premise to which the licence relates; or
 - 9.5.3 Refuse to permit the **person** and such service animal to remain in or upon such place or premise by reason only of the presence of such service animal.
- 9.6 A **licensee** shall keep and maintain all records required to be kept under this Bylaw for a period of two (2) years unless otherwise provided by this Bylaw.

10. Licence – Administrative Suspensions

- 10.1 Where required in accordance with this Bylaw, a **licensee's** policy of liability insurance expires, is cancelled, or is otherwise terminated; the applicable licence shall be automatically suspended effective on the date of such expiration, cancellation, revocation or termination and shall remain so until such insurance has been reinstated.
- 10.2 An administrative suspension of a licence without a hearing shall be imposed for fourteen (14) days if the licence issuer is satisfied that the continuation of the business poses an immediate danger to the health and safety of any **person** or to any premises, or in accordance with Section 11. Before any suspension is imposed, the licence issuer shall provide the **licensee** with the reasons for the suspension, either orally or in writing, and an opportunity to respond to them.
- 10.3 An administrative suspension imposed under Section 10.2 may be imposed on such conditions as the licence issuer considers appropriate.

11. Licence – Grounds for Refusal, Revocation or Suspension

- 11.1 An **applicant** or **licensee** is entitled to a licence upon meeting the requirements of this Bylaw except where:
- 11.1.1 The past or present conduct of any **person**, including any partner, the officers, directors, or employees, or agents of a **corporation**, affords reasonable cause to believe that the **person** will not carry on or engage in the business in respect of which the application is made in accordance with the law or with honesty or integrity; or
 - 11.1.2 The **applicant** or **licensee** has past breaches or contraventions of any law or any provision of the Bylaw or any other municipal bylaw or Provincial or Federal Statute associated with the carrying on of such business; or
 - 11.1.3 The financial position of the **applicant** or **licensee** affords reasonable grounds to believe that the activity for which they are licensed or to continue to be licensed in accordance with the law will not be carried on in a financially responsible manner; or
 - 11.1.4 The **applicant** or **licensee** has failed to pay a fine or fines imposed by a Court for convictions for breach of this or any other bylaw; or
 - 11.1.5 The **applicant** or **licensee** has failed to comply with any term, condition or direction of the licence issuer or **officer** or has failed to permit any investigation by the licence issuer or **officer**; or
 - 11.1.6 The **applicant** or **licensee** has failed to comply with the requirements set out in the Bylaw or any of the applicable Schedules of this Bylaw; or
 - 11.1.7 Issuing of a licence would be contrary to the public interest with respect to health and safety or consumer protection; or
 - 11.1.8 The **applicant** or **licensee** has submitted an application or other documents to the **Town** containing false statements, incorrect, incomplete, or misleading information; or
 - 11.1.9 The **applicant** or **licensee** is carrying on or engaging in activities on or off the premises that are, or will be, if the **applicant** or **licensee** is licensed, in contravention of the Bylaw, any other applicable law is dangerous or unsafe; or
 - 11.1.10 The **applicant** or **licensee** has exhibited discriminatory behaviour against a **person** or on any grounds protected by the Ontario Human Rights Code; or
 - 11.1.11 The **applicant** or **licensee** has not paid the required licence fees; or

11.1.12 In the case of the **applicant** or **licensee** who failed to meet the requirements set out in Section 7 of the Bylaw.

11.2 The licence issuer may revoke, suspend, refuse to issue, or refuse to renew a licence where the **applicant** or **licensee** would not be entitled to a licence, or to the renewal of a licence, on any grounds set out in this Bylaw.

11.3 Where the application for a licence has been revoked, suspended or cancelled, the fees paid by the **applicant** or **licensee**, in respect of the licence, shall not be refunded.

11.4 No **person** shall reapply to obtain or renew a licence for a minimum of one (1) year from the later of:

11.4.1 The date of the licence issuer's decision to refuse to issue, renew or revoke a licence; or

11.4.2 Where the decision of the licence issuer is appealed, the date of the appeal tribunal's decision is the date of the appeal tribunal's decision if the appeal tribunal upholds the decision to refuse to issue, renew or revoke the licence.

12. Licence – Grounds for Refusal, Revocation or Suspension – Terms and Conditions – Right to a Hearing

12.1 With the exception of Section 10, before the licence is refused, revoked, suspended, cancelled or issued with terms or conditions, written notice shall be given by the licence issuer to the **applicant** or **licensee**.

12.2 Notice shall be served to the **applicant's** or **licensee's** last known address or email address filed with the **Town** and shall:

12.2.1 Contain sufficient information to specify the nature of, or reason for, any recommendation; and

12.2.2 Inform the **applicant** or **licensee** of entitlement to a hearing before the appeal tribunal, if a request in writing for a hearing is returned to the **Clerk** within fourteen (14) days after the date of service of the notice; and

12.3 On receipt of a written request for a hearing from an **applicant** or **licensee**, the **Clerk** shall:

12.3.1 Schedule a hearing; and

12.3.2 Give the **applicant** or **licensee** notice of the hearing at least twenty (20) days prior to the hearing date; and

12.3.3 Post notice of the hearing on the **Town's** website at least twenty (20) days prior to the hearing date.

12.4 Service of any notice on the **applicant** or **licensee** under this bylaw shall be made by personal delivery, ordinary mail or email transmission. The notice shall be deemed to have been served on the fourth (4th) day after the day of mailing or on the date of personal service or on the date of email transmission.

13. Establishment of Appeal Tribunal

13.1 The appeal tribunal shall hear and render decisions regarding the refusal, revocation or suspension of a licence, and the imposing of terms and conditions on a licence.

13.2 The decision of the appeal tribunal shall be final and binding.

14. Hearing Process

14.1 The provisions of the *Statutory Powers and Procedures Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. S. 22, as amended, shall apply to all hearings conducted under this Bylaw.

14.2 A hearing shall be held in public, unless determined otherwise in accordance with the *Statutory Powers and Procedures Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. S. 22, as amended, and the appeal tribunal shall hear the **applicant** or **licensee** and every other **person** who desires to be heard, and the appeal tribunal may give its decision orally or adjourn the hearing and reserve its decision but in any case the decision shall be provided in writing.

14.3 The decision of the appeal tribunal shall be in writing and shall set out the reasons for the decision and shall be signed.

14.4 Any authority or permission granted by the appeal tribunal may be for such time and subject to such terms and conditions as the appeal tribunal considers advisable and as are set out in the decision.

15. Orders

15.1 If an officer has reasonable grounds to believe that a contravention of this bylaw has occurred, the officer may make an order requiring the **person** who contravened this bylaw or who caused or permitted the contravention to occur to:

15.1.1 Discontinue the contravening activity; and/or

15.1.2 Do work or take action to correct the contravention.

15.2 An Order under section 15.1 shall set out:

15.2.1 Reasonable particulars of the contravention adequate to identify the contravention;

15.2.2 The location of the premises on which the contravention occurred; and

15.2.3 Either:

a) In the case of an Order under section 15.1.1, the date by which there must be compliance with the Order; or

b) In the case of an Order under section 15.1.2, the action to be done and the date by which the action must be done.

15.3 An Order made under this Bylaw may be served personally, by ordinary mail to the last known address or by email transmission to:

15.3.1 The **person** the **officer** believed contravened this bylaw; and

15.3.2 Such other **persons** affected by the Order as the **officer** making the Order determines.

15.4 The Order shall be deemed to have been served on the fourth (4th) day after the date of mailing or on the date of personal service or on the date of email transmission.

15.5 An Order may also be served by an **officer** by posting the Order in a conspicuous location on the premises, and such posting shall be deemed to be sufficient service. Service under this subsection shall be deemed to have been effected on the date the Order is posted.

16. Enforcement and penalty provisions

16.1 The enforcement of this bylaw shall be conducted by an officer.

16.2 An officer may, without a warrant enter on land at any reasonable time for the purpose of carrying out an inspection to determine whether or not:

16.2.1 The bylaw is complied with;

16.2.2 The licence, or the term or condition of a licence, or this Bylaw is complied with; or

16.2.3 A direction or Order made under the *Municipal Act, S.O. 2001, c. 25*, as amended, or this Bylaw is complied with.

16.3 For the purposes of an inspection under this bylaw, an officer may:

- 16.3.1 require the production for inspection of documents or things relevant to the inspection;
 - 16.3.2 inspect and remove documents or things relevant to the inspection for the purpose of making copies or extracts;
 - 16.3.3 require information from any **person** concerning a matter related to the inspection; and
 - 16.3.4 alone or in conjunction with a **person** possessing special or expert knowledge, make examinations or take tests, samples or photographs necessary for the purposes of the inspection.
- 16.4 All documents and records shall be kept in a good and business-like manner for review by the officer at their request.
- 16.5 A receipt shall be provided for any document or thing removed under this bylaw, and the document or thing shall be promptly returned after the copies or extracts are made.
- 16.6 Every **person** who contravenes any provision of this bylaw, including failing to comply with an order made under this bylaw, is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine and such other penalties as provided for in the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.33, as amended, and the Municipal Act, as amended.
- 16.7 Every **person** who is charged with an offence under this bylaw or an order issued pursuant to this bylaw or every director or officer of a **corporation**, who knowingly concurs in the contravention by the laying of an information under Part III of the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P. 33, as amended, is guilty of an offence and if found guilty of the offence is liable pursuant to the Municipal Act, as amended, to the following:
- 16.7.1 On a first offence, to a fine not more than \$50,000.00; and
 - 16.7.2 On a second offence and each subsequent offence, to a fine not more than \$100,000.00
- 16.8 Every **person** who is issued a Part 1 offence notice or summons upon conviction is guilty of an offence under this bylaw and shall be subject to a fine, to a maximum as provided for in the *Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P. 33*, as amended.
- 16.9 No **person** shall fail to comply with an Order issued under this Bylaw.

- 16.10 Every **person** who is alleged to have contravened any of the provisions of this Bylaw shall identify themselves to an **officer** upon request; failure to do so shall be deemed to have hindered or obstructed an **officer** in the execution of his or her duties.
- 16.11 Upon conviction, any penalty imposed under this bylaw may be collected under the authority of the *Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P. 33*, as amended.
- 16.12 If a **person** is convicted of an offence under this bylaw, the court in which the conviction has been entered and any court of competent jurisdiction may, in addition to any other remedy and to any penalty imposed, make an order prohibiting the continuation or repetition of the offence by the **person** convicted.
- 16.13 Sections 3, 4, and 16.9, inclusive of all subsections thereunder, of this bylaw are hereby designated as parts of this bylaw to which the Administrative Penalty System bylaw applies
- 16.14 Any **person** who contravenes any designated provisions of this bylaw shall, upon issuance of a penalty notice in accordance with the Administrative System bylaw, be liable to pay an administrative penalty and any administrative fees.
- 16.15 A **person** shall not be subject to both an administrative penalty and prosecution under the *Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P. 33*, as amended for the same contravention.
- 16.16 Each day that a contravention continues shall constitute a separate offence, and a separate administrative penalty may be issued.

17. Severability

- 17.1 If a court of competent jurisdiction declares any section or part of this bylaw invalid, it is the intention of **council** that the remainder of this bylaw shall continue in force unless the court makes an order to the contrary.

18. Interpretation

- 18.1 References in this bylaw to any statute or statutory provision include references to that statute or statutory provision as it may from time to time be amended, extended or re-enacted.
- 18.2 In this bylaw, unless the context otherwise requires, words importing the singular shall include the plural and use of the masculine shall include the feminine, where applicable.

18.3 This bylaw shall come into effect upon approval by the Council, subject to section 284.11 of the *Municipal Act*.

19. Transitional Matters

19.1 Existing Salvage Yard operations in the Town of Orangeville, as of the date of passing this bylaw, will be provided with a ninety (90) day transitional period for which to obtain the required documents necessary for licensing and to come into compliance with the requirements of this bylaw.
