



Hen Registration Summary of Additional Regulations:

Maintenance:

- Hen coops shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition free from the accumulation of feces, offensive odours, and insect or rodent infestations.
- Feces shall be removed from hen coops daily and deposited in a secured water receptacle or composter. The waste receptacles or composters must be stored in the rear yard, at least 3m from any lot line and maintained to prevent offensive odours and be emptied regularly.

Storage of Feed:

- Ensure feeding of hens is done in a manner that minimizes the attraction of rodents or other animals.
- Feed is to be stored in rodent proof containers and secured at all times to prevent entry of rodents or other animals.

Keeping of Hens:

- The hen must be kept in the hen coop at all times and the hen coop roof and door must be locked between 9:00 p.m. one day and 6:00 a.m. of the following day.

Prohibited Activities:

- Eggs, manure, meat or tother products associated with the keeping of hens cannot be sold from the property.
- Hens cannot be slaughtered or butchered on the property.

Disposal of Deceased Hens:

- Dead hens are to be disposed of immediately through a livestock disposal facility, veterinarian services, or a facility approved by the applicable provincial Ministry.

No person shall keep a hen in the Town beyond December 31, 2023.
