

#### Fire Hydrant Flushing and Maintenance Programs

To Users of the Following Water Systems:

- Orangeville Water System
- Cardinal Woods Water System (Mono)
- Coles/Island Lake/Purple Hill Water System (Mono)

Please be aware that from April 1 to October 31, 2021 between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday through Friday each week, Orangeville Water Works staff will be completing fire hydrant flushing and maintenance programs in the water systems noted above. The programs are completed on a regular basis to ensure fire hydrants remain in good working order and that any accumulated sediments in the water mains are removed.

Due to possible sedimentation, the flushing may cause discoloration of the water, so please check your cold-water supply before use. If discoloration does occur, run the cold water until it clears.

Users of the Orangeville and Mono water systems are also reminded that Water Works Staff will continue regular flushing of fire hydrants in selected areas on subsequent Wednesdays as part of an ongoing maintenance program. Again, the water should be checked for discoloration before use on those days.

Your co-operation and understanding are appreciated during the fire hydrant flushing and maintenance programs.
