

Notice of Complete Application for a Zoning By-law Amendment (File No. RZ-2020-02)

Take Notice that the Corporation of the Town of Orangeville is in receipt of a complete application to amend the Town's Zoning By-law No. 22-90, as amended, pursuant to Section 34 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990.

Description of the Subject Land:

The land subject to this application is comprised of one parcel located at the southwest corner of Ada Street and Elizabeth Street. The subject land is legally described as Part of Lots 1 and 2, Block 4 of Registered Plan No. 237 and is municipally known as 200 Elizabeth Street. The subject land has a total area of approximately 0.11 hectares (0.28 acres), with approximately 30 metres (98 feet) of frontage along Elizabeth Street and 36 metres (118 feet) of frontage along Ada Street. The subject land currently contains a mixed-use detached dwelling, with residential access from Ada Street, and access to a convenience retail use from Elizabeth Street. A location map of the subject land is attached.

Purpose and Effect of the Applications:

The purpose and effect of the application is to permit the development of four (4) semi-detached dwellings and a 79.43 sq. m. convenience retail store. The residential units are proposed to front onto Ada Street. The proposed convenience retail store is contained within the ground floor of the northern-most semi-detached dwelling, fronting onto Elizabeth Street. The dwellings are proposed to be 2-storeys in height.

The Zoning By-law Amendment proposes to rezone the subject lands from Neighbourhood Commercial C2 Zone with Special Provision 24.46A, to Neighbourhood Commercial C2 Zone with Special Provision 24.XXX and Holding (H) symbol to permit the proposed development.

Fire Hydrant Flushing and Maintenance Programs

To Users of the Following Water Systems:

- · Orangeville Water System
- Cardinal Woods Water System (Mono)
- · Coles/Island Lake/Purple Hill Water System (Mono)

Please be aware that from April 1 to October 31, 2021 between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday through Friday each week, Orangeville Water Works Staff will be completing fire hydrant flushing and maintenance programs in the water systems noted above. The programs are completed on a regular basis to ensure fire hydrants remain in good working order and that any accumulated sediments in the watermains are removed.

Due to possible sedimentation, the flushing may cause discolouration of the water, so please check your cold-water supply before use. If discolouration does occur, run the cold water until it clears.

Users of the Orangeville and Mono water systems are also reminded that Water Works Staff will continue regular flushing of fire hydrants in selected areas on subsequent Wednesdays as part of an ongoing maintenance program. Again, the water should be checked for discolouration before use on those days.

Your co-operation and understanding are appreciated during the fire hydrant flushing and maintenance programs.

Take Notice that the Corporation of the Town of Orangeville has initiated a review of its Official Plan pursuant to Section 26 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.13 and will hold a Public Open House on:

Monday April 19, 2021 (no earlier than 7 p.m.) Council Chambers, Town Hall, 87 Broadway, Orangeville, Ontario

Purpose of the Official Plan Review:

The Town's Official Plan is a statutory policy document that guides planning decisions for the community and provides direction on how growth and land use should be managed in the Town.

Ontario's land use planning system applies a provincial policy-driven framework that requires the Town's Official Plan and any municipal planning decisions to align with provincial planning policies (i.e. conform to provincial plans and be consistent with provincial policy statements) issued under the authority of the Planning Act.

The purpose of the Town's Official Plan review is to ensure its policies maintain their consistency/conformity with provincial plans/ policies and continue to address local planning priorities and evolving community interests. The process for this review is a two-phased approach, initially focusing on housekeeping updates and corrections to policy language. A second review phase will follow and will evaluate growth management and land use allocation aspects of the Official Plan.

Public Open House:

The Town is holding a Public Open House as required by Section 17(16) of the Planning Act, to discuss and receive input on proposed policy amendments to the Official Plan, as well as related information and materials that have been prepared as part of this review process.

How to participate in the Public Open House:

Due to efforts to contain the spread of COVID-19 and to protect all individuals, the Council Chambers at Town Hall will not be open to the public to attend Council meetings until further notice.
