Loose Leaf Collection

Beginning in late October, loose leaves will be collected on Orangeville streets with mature boulevard trees only, using a vacuum truck. The Town will be divided in two zones - north of Broadway and south of Broadway. Collection will run for approximately four weeks and will be weather dependent.

All other yard waste from your property (leaves, branches, brush) can be set out in bags, bundles or labelled containers for collection in the County's regular bi-weekly yard waste program, which will continue to run until the end of November.

Rake leaves from boulevard trees only (those trees on the town's right of way) to the curb. Please do not rake leaves onto the road.

Description of the Subject Land:

The lands subject to these applications are located west of Blind Line and north of Hansen Boulevard. The subject lands are legally described as Part of Lots 2 and 3, Concession 3 in the Town of Orangeville and have a total area of approximately 14.28 hectares (35.29 acres). The subject lands are municipally known as 320 Blind Line and consist of a vacant property generally located within the northwest quadrant of the Town. A location map of the subject lands is attached.

Purpose and Effect of the Application:

The purpose and effect of the applications are to facilitate the development of a proposed plan of subdivision containing 90 single-detached dwellings, as well as blocks for low-density multiple

(townhouse) dwellings at a maximum of 70 units, medium-density multiple dwellings at a maximum of 183 units, neighbourhood commercial and open space conservation uses.

The Official Plan Amendment proposes to revise the current Low Density Residential and Open Space Conservation designation boundaries to match the development limits of the proposed plan of subdivision. The amendment also proposes to alter the location of the existing neighbourhood commercial

designation and redesignate portions of the site to Low Density Multiple and Medium Density to permit the proposed townhouse units. The Zoning By-law Amendment proposes to rezone the subject lands from Development (D) zone to Residential Fourth Density (R4) with special provisions (SP 24.169 and 24.170), Residential Fifth Density (R5) and Multiple Residential Medium Density (RM1) zones subject to a Holding (H) symbol, as well as Open Space Conservation (OS2) and Neighbourhood Commercial (C2) zones, in order to permit the proposed development.

Description of the Subject Land:

The lands subject to these applications are located west of Eastview Crescent and Patterson Court and northwest of the intersection of Hansen Boulevard and Blind Line. The subject lands are legally described as Part of Lot 3, Concession 3 in the Town of Orangeville and have a total area of approximately 20.63 hectares (50.98 acres). The subject lands consist of a vacant property within the northwest quadrant of the Town, adjacent to the northern urban boundary. A location map of the subject lands is attached.

Purpose and Effect of the Application:

The purpose and effect of the applications are to facilitate the development of a proposed plan of subdivision containing 64 single-detached dwellings, as well as blocks for a public school, open space conservation and future development uses.

The Official Plan Amendment proposes to revise the current Low Density Residential and Open Space Conservation designation boundaries to match the development limits of the proposed plan of subdivision and to redesignate the central portion of the site to Institutional. The Zoning By-law

Amendment proposes to rezone the subject lands from Development (D) zone to Residential Fourth Density (R4) zone with special provisions (SP 24.170) subject to a Holding (H) symbol, as well as Institutional (I), Open Space - Conservation (OS2) zones, in order to permit the proposed development.
