

 The natural landscapes in and around Orangeville offer scenic views and varied ways to experience the great outdoors. Over 20 kilometres of multi-use trails create connections between our community's parks, neighbourhoods, and public spaces. On the Town's northeast corner, Island Lake Conservation Area is a four-season outdoor oasis with over 800 acres of lake, wetland, and forest. Don't miss the park's signature lakeside loop, an accessible eight-kilometre route that features expansive boardwalks and dynamic views.

Beyond our borders, Orangeville's appeal is enhanced by the natural beauty of the surrounding area. The Bruce Trail is just one of many routes that ramble through provincial parks, conservation areas, and the

stunning Niagara Escarpment. Hiking, cycling, golfing, and skiing are just a few of the activities available for outdoor enthusiasts.




