Many talented artists call Orangeville home and their work is on display throughout the community. Treasures and artwork line shop shelves and adorn cafe walls. Local artists invite visitors into their open studios and teach their craft at a variety of classes.

Orangeville's collection of public art adds a surprising touch of creativity to every visit. Prepare to discover unique pieces displayed in delightful ways from extraordinary tree sculptures to distinctive utility boxes. On a larger scale, you can't miss the glorious Mantis Queen or the stately sculpture of Orange Lawrence, our Town's founder. Historic images and colourful murals round out the collection.

At the centre of Orangeville's performing arts scene is Theatre Orangeville. Performers and patrons return time and again to experience the intimacy and excellence of the company's live, professional performances. Many of Theatre Orangeville's shows are presented in the Opera House, the community's historic hub for live entertainment.

Enjoy every season

The natural landscapes in and around Orangeville offer scenic views and varied ways to experience the great outdoors. Over 20 kilometres of multi-use trails create connections between our community's parks, neighbourhoods, and public spaces. On the Town's northeast corner, Island Lake Conservation Area is a four-season outdoor oasis with over 800 acres of lake, wetland, and forest. Don't miss the park's signature lakeside loop, an accessible eight-kilometre route that features expansive boardwalks and dynamic views.

Beyond our borders, Orangeville's appeal is enhanced by the natural beauty of the surrounding area. The Bruce Trail is just one of many routes that ramble through provincial parks, conservation areas, and the stunning Niagara Escarpment. Hiking, cycling, golfing, and skiing are just a few of the activities available for outdoor enthusiasts.
